1. Compare Moses' story to that of Our Lord Jesus Christ. (p. 26-27)

2. Why was the blood of the Lamb in the passover put on the door post and not allowed to touch the ground? (p.28)

3. In Exodus 17, there is a detailed account of the rituals to be followed on The Passover. Taking three of the symbols, explain their relevance to the New Testament and The Eucharist. Quote and reference. (p.29-31)

4. In what manner was the passover intended to be eaten? Why? Quote and reference. (p.30-31)

5. What replaced The Passover in the New Testament. How is this feast different from the Passover? (p.31 and other parts in the chapter).

6. What does Fr. Daoud believe the word "Manna" means? In other words, why was the bread named "Manna"? (p.33)

7. In *Numbers 21:5*, the Jews complain saying "our soul loathes this worthless bread". Why did they say that? How does that apply to our relationship to The Body and Blood of Our Lord? (p.34)

8. What did the Manna taste like? Why? Quote and reference.(p.35)

9. Fr. Daoud writes that there was a strong connection between the Manna and something else. What is it? And what is his reasoning? Quote and reference. (p.34)

10. What are the three parts of the Tabernacle of Meeting and in which one was the bread of faces placed? (p.38)

11. Fr. Daoud mentions that the bread of faces was placed with two things. What are they and what do they represent? Quote and reference. (p.39)

12. What does the number of this question always represent in the Old Testament? Quote and reference. (p.39)

13. How did the Bread of Faces get it's name? How is it's name relevant to it being a symbol of The Eucharist? (p. 39)

14. Mention three account of veils in the Old Testament. (Look through the Chapter).

15. Name as many symbols of the Eucharist as you can so far. Do at Least 4, but I know you can do better. (Hint: The titles of the chapters should help).
